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#### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Tomorrow marks the completion of my first semester as Glenmore's Principal. There have certainly been challenges along the way, but on reflection, Glenmore is still well and truly on track. Our teaching practices are exemplary and student achievement continuing to strengthen as it has done over the last 2 years. As the "new" Principal, I must thank parents and members of the broader Glenmore school community for your support during Semester 1 and look forward to your continued support in Semester 2. We always aim to make decisions and to act in the very best interests of your children.

The effective leadership of our school relies heavily on teamwork, especially between Principal and Deputy Principal. I wish to acknowledge the outstanding work of Mrs Lanyon this semester in the Deputy Principal's role. I could not do my job without the support of Mrs Lanyon. I often joke that Mrs Lanyon has forgotten more about Prep to Year 2 than I ever knew in the first place. Our particular strengths and areas of expertise have worked well together for Glenmore and we both share the strong belief that Glenmore kids can achieve.

I am pleased to convey to the school community that Mrs Lanyon will continue the Acting Deputy Principal's role for the remainder of the year. Ms Kelly will continue as Acting Head of Special Education Services. Ms Kelly also plays a vital role in the leadership team at Glenmore and has had some of her work presented in the district as exemplary. Mrs Harris will continue in Learning Support and I know 2CN are delighted that Miss Nugent will also be continuing as their teacher next semester.

As I advised by letter yesterday, we may not be able to forward student reports to parents this week due to a state-wide problem with OneSchool. I attempted to print reports yesterday and today, but it is looking more likely that we will have to forward these in the first week back after the holidays.

The following information puts into perspective some key points about the student reports and ratings.

Over recent years, parents, students and teachers across Queensland have been using a 5-point scale (e.g. A-E) process for reporting in all schools. The system we use refers to attainment standards called "benchmarks of achievement" or "criteria." So what makes an "A", "B", "C", "D" or "E" is predetermined by a scale of achievement. Any student who shows evidence of meeting a particular level, is awarded that rating. It is important to understand what a "C" means.

A "C" means that the student has met the criteria for a learner to be at the appropriate age level.

A "C" means that the student is doing everything required at their Year Level at school. The best description is to say that a "C" means that the student's academic development is exactly where it needs to be.

***That means attaining a "C" for Achievement means you are ON TARGET for your age level!***

With all of this in mind, we must accept that it may be harder to get an "A" or "B". These grades are not awarded simply to the top students in the class. They are only given to students who show that they are independently capable of working beyond the criteria required for their Year Level.

This week's interhouse carnival was the best one in my time at Glenmore. The team spirit and sportsmanship were terrific and the day ran smoothly due to the meticulous planning of Mr McArthur. It was great to see the large number of family members who came along to cheer for their children. Well done to all our age champions and winning houses, and also to all our students who put in their best effort on the day to earn points for their house.

School recommences on Monday 13 July. It is important that students return on time. Next semester we will increase the focus on attendance. Attendance rates less than 92% put student achievement at risk. We CAN do 92. Every day counts for Glenmore kids.

On behalf of the Glenmore staff, I wish students and their families a safe and relaxing holiday. Thank you again for your support this semester.

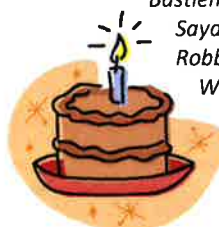
