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## PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Welcome back to Glenmore for Semester 2. Despite the chilly start to the week, students were straight back into learning. When I visited classrooms first up on Monday morning, reading warm-ups and reading hour were well under way. Thank you to the Glenmore parents who ensured their children were back at school on time. Every day counts for Glenmore kids.

I am pleased to say that student reports were sent home, eventually, on Wednesday this week. Generating the reports for printing was still not without difficulties, but Mrs Snow persevered and we completed the printing on Tuesday. Overall, Semester 1 report data was pleasing. I am especially happy with the percentage of students who received a C or better for effort and behaviour – both above 90%.

As I outlined last term:

A “C” means that the student has met the criteria for a learner to be at the appropriate age level.

A “C” means that the student is doing everything required at their Year Level at school. The best description is to say that a “C” means that the student’s academic development is exactly where it needs to be.

***That means attaining a “C” for Achievement means you are ON TARGET for your age level!***

This week, provisional NAPLAN data was released to schools. This data included students’ raw score and whether answers were correct or incorrect. Full NAPLAN data, with bands and scale scores, will be released on 31 July. Our provisional results look very solid, with Year 3 continuing to build on the improvement of the past two years and Year 5 performing noticeably better than last year.

During Semester 2, all Glenmore classes will visit Glenmore High for a Science lesson in a Science laboratory. These Science lessons will link closely with units of work that students are doing in their class here at Glenmore Primary School. Thank you to Mrs Allison for coordinating the timetable and Science topics and to the Glenmore High Science staff for offering this opportunity. In addition to these lessons, our students will be able to attend astronomy nights at Glenmore High. These activities help forge strong links between the two schools.

This term, we are hosting a number of university students from CQ University and USQ for their Professional Practice rounds. Three fourth-year students will be completing their internships with Prep KB, 1 DN and 1 JM and will be at Glenmore for the whole ten weeks of Term 3. We also have three second-year students and a first-year student, who will be working with 3LO, 5MK, 6MM and 3/4RS. Glenmore plays a key role in the development of new teachers and these university students will see exemplary teaching practice with our Fleming Model of Explicit Instruction.

The 2015 School Opinion Survey is underway. Parent survey information was sent home on Monday. This year, parent, staff and student surveys are all completed online. The survey is open until Friday 31 July.

This week, we welcome Mrs Hill to Glenmore. Mrs Hill is replacing Mrs Harris (Learning Support) until the end of week 4. Mrs Hill is a highly skilled teacher and will be working with students to improve their reading.

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## NEWS FROM THE DEPUTY ....

Welcome back to term 3 – a rather chilly start but it certainly wakes you up! This semester I am going to include an article each week about aspects of parenting. Being a parent is one of the hardest jobs and it is one where you are never sure if you are getting it right! Reading information from experts can help to confirm what you already do or it may give you some ideas of how to handle a situation you may be facing. This week's article has been written by a well-known 'parenting expert' - Michael Grose...

### Teach your kids about time and place

My mum used to tell me, *"There's a time and place for everything Michael, and this is not the time and place to behave like that!"*

**Time and place** is a brilliant socialisation lesson for children of any age or era to absorb.

It's a parent's job to socialise your kids. That is, it's your job to develop a sense of OTHER so that they become aware of how their behaviour impacts on others. You do this by:

#### 1. Giving your kids social scripts

There are times when kids don't know what to say or how to act in different social situations. *"Here's what you can say when you meet Mrs Smith..."* is the type of pre-emptive social scripting that benefits most boys, kids on the autism spectrum as well as kids who need extra help to get on with others.

#### 2. Regular behaviour rehearsal

Practise appropriate social behaviours at home so kids know how to behave around others. For example, you can role-play a restaurant situation by serving your kids' meals at the dinner table and expecting them to use their manners.

#### 3. Just-in-time prompts

It helps to remind in positive terms how kids should speak and act around others before entering a social situation or a special place such as a church, airport or restaurant. *"In church most people..."*

#### 4. Teaching good manners

Manners are social guidelines that teach kids how to behave around others. While some conventions change over time, basic good manners such as saying 'please' and 'thank you' never change. They are the basis of a civil society. Kids are never too young to start learning manners.

#### 5. Respectful use of consequences

While the best discipline happens before an event (*through behaviour rehearsal, prompts and teaching manners*) there are times when the only way to get a message across about time and place is to DO something if the kids' behaviour thoughtlessly or deliberately impinges on the rights of others. And the best action may be WITHDRAWAL from the place or activity that they are doing. That may mean that the kids (and you) miss out on an activity or being in a special place but such lessons are rarely forgotten and reinforce your important messages.

**Time and place** is a great parenting message for kids to learn. It's about consideration for others; it's about self-control and above all else, it's about fitting into different social situations.

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#### School Uniforms:

The school has a supply of donated clothing that can be used to help new families to the school. It is also used for times when a student requires a change of clothing. Most of the time, these uniforms return to school. However, there are situations where this is not possible. At the moment, our supply of extra clothing is running short – especially the smaller sizes 6 to 8. If you have any old uniforms at home that you no longer need, please consider donating these to the school. Your support in this matter is very much appreciated.

#### Cold weather:

### Premier's Reading Challenge

Just a reminder to keep reading and recording your books for the Premier's Reading Challenge. Every student who meets the challenge will be rewarded with a Premier's Reading Challenge Certificate. Students in Prep to Year 2 need to read or "experience" 20 books, students in Years 3 and 4 need to read 20 books and students in Years 5 and 6 need to read 15 books. Students have until August 28 to complete their reading.

### Get Started Vouchers Round 6 – NOW OPEN Information for Parents/Carers/Guardians

*Get Started Vouchers* assists children and young people who can least afford or may otherwise benefit from joining a sport or active recreation club. Eligible children and young people can apply for a voucher valued up to \$150, which can be redeemed at a sport or recreation club that is registered for *Get Started Vouchers*. Children and young people are eligible to apply for a voucher if they are a Queensland resident aged from 5 to 17 (inclusive) at the time of application, and:

- the child, or their parent, carer or guardian, holds a Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or
- the child's application is supported by two [referral agents](#)

Eligible children and young people who received a voucher in 2014 are eligible to apply for a voucher in 2015. If your child received a voucher in round 5, they are not eligible for a voucher in round 6. **Vouchers are issued on a first come, first served basis.** Once the vouchers are fully allocated for a round, no further vouchers will be issued.

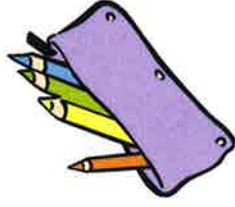
