Under this agreement for 2020 Glenmore State School will receive

\$259 942*

This funding will be used to

- Provide wellbeing and social support through additional Guidance Officer time to students in need.
- Provide Speech and Language Pathologist support to those behind their reading age building foundational skill sets.
- Enhance student engagement leading to reduced behaviour incidences and greater skillsets of staff.
- Building the skillsets of highly abled students (Upper 2 Band [U2B]) and enhancing staff differentiation skillsets of all students.

Our initiatives include

2020 Annual Improvement Plan key improvements are to a) develop and grow the capabilities of staff to quality assure the Australian Curriculum and b) enhance staff and student engagement. Additional staff funding will support staff and student skillsets and lead to better school outcomes. These include:

- Differentiated practices catering to the needs of all students.
- Understanding of the Australian Curriculum to enhance student results – above 87%.
- Greater engagement support and upskilling for staff to ensure success for all students.
- Greater support for identified students so that they have opportunities to succeed.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

Key improvement initiatives in 2020 will focus on providing additional teaching support to the diverse range of students at Glenmore State School. These are as follows:

- Additional Guidance and Counselling support (0.2FTE) to provide intensive support to our high needs students and families and assist with the verification process of undiagnosed students. (\$28 000).
- School funded Engagement Coordinator (1.0 FTE) to support student engagement and the restructuring of the Glenmore Expectations including PBL and Berry Street Education Model. (\$96 000).
- School funded Extension Coordinator (1.0 FTE) to embed Mathematics, English, Technology, Acceleration Program for U2B students and upskilling staff on curriculum planning and pedagogical practices to support student learning. (\$100 000)
- 0.4 FTE Speech and Language Pathologist (\$35 942) support to build foundation skillsets of students, particularly P-3.
